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**MINUTES OF THE STAKEHOLDERS' MEETING BETWEEN PRIVATE
SECTOR REPRESENTATIVES AND THE MUNICIPAL BOARD ON
ENHANCING A CLEAN, SECURE AND WELL-PLANNED URBAN CENTER
IN ISIOLO MUNICIPALITY**

Venue: Municipal Boardroom, Isiolo Municipality

Date: 9th January 2025

Time: 10.00 A.M

1. Opening of the Meeting

The meeting was called to order by Mr Hassan Wario, the Chairperson of the Municipal Board of Isiolo Municipality. The Chair welcomed members of the private sector, particularly representatives from the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce and Industry (Isiolo Chapter), and other stakeholders present.

The Chair noted that the purpose of the meeting was to strengthen collaboration between the public sector and private sector in improving the urban environment within Isiolo County. The meeting aimed to discuss strategies for maintaining a clean, secure, organized, and economically vibrant urban center that supports business growth and improves the quality of life for residents.

The Chair emphasized that sustainable urban development requires active participation of the private sector, especially in areas such as environmental



cleanliness, urban security, infrastructure maintenance, and compliance with planning regulations.

2. Attendance

The meeting was attended by representatives from the following institutions and groups:

MIN/1/1/2025 Adoption of Agenda

The following agenda items were adopted:

1. Enhancing urban cleanliness and waste management
2. Strengthening urban security within the Central Business District (CBD)
3. Urban planning compliance and orderly development
4. Private sector participation in urban development initiatives
5. Public-private partnership opportunities
6. Resolutions and way forward

MIN/2/1/2025 Presentations and Deliberations/Enhancing Urban Cleanliness and Waste Management

Officials from the Environment and Urban Services Department of Isiolo County Government presented the current waste management challenges affecting the urban center.

Key issues highlighted included:

- Increasing solid waste generation due to urban growth and business expansion
- Inadequate waste disposal practices by some businesses and traders
- Limited waste collection points in some sections of the Central Business District
- Illegal dumping of waste along roads and drainage channels

Private sector representatives acknowledged the need for improved environmental management and expressed willingness to collaborate with the municipality.

Proposed interventions included:

- Establishment of additional waste collection points within commercial areas
- Regular waste collection schedules coordinated with businesses
- Business community participation in urban cleanliness campaigns
- Enforcement of environmental and sanitation by-laws
- Promotion of waste reduction, recycling, and responsible disposal practices

MIN/1/2/2025 Urban Security and Safety

Representatives from the National Police Service provided an overview of the security situation within the urban center.

Key security concerns identified included:

- Petty crimes such as pickpocketing and theft in crowded areas
- Insufficient lighting in certain streets and alleys
- Unregulated activities in some transport stages and market areas
- Limited surveillance systems within commercial zones

The private sector emphasized that security is essential for creating a favorable business environment.

Proposed security measures included:

- Installation of street lighting in poorly lit areas
- Collaboration between businesses and security agencies in surveillance initiatives
- Establishment of a community policing framework
- Strengthening patrols within the Central Business District
- Exploration of CCTV installation in strategic commercial locations

MIN/3/2025 Urban Planning Compliance and Orderly Development

The Chamber expressed willingness to partner with Isiolo Municipality in promoting responsible business practices that contribute to sustainable urban growth.

MIN/1/4/2025 Public-Private Partnership Opportunities

The meeting discussed opportunities for strengthening collaboration between the public and private sectors through structured engagement frameworks.

Potential areas of collaboration included:

- Waste management and recycling initiatives
- Development and maintenance of urban public spaces
- Construction and management of parking facilities
- Smart city initiatives such as surveillance systems and urban lighting
- Support for organized markets and business zones

The meeting emphasized that partnerships between the County Government and the private sector can significantly enhance service delivery and economic growth within Isiolo County.

MIN 1/5/2025 Resolutions

After deliberations, the meeting resolved that:

1. Isiolo Municipality and the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce and Industry (Isiolo Chapter) shall establish a joint working group to coordinate urban cleanliness, security, and planning initiatives.
2. The business community shall collaborate with the municipality in promoting responsible waste management and maintaining clean commercial premises.
3. Security agencies and the private sector shall explore partnerships in the installation of street lighting and surveillance systems within the Central Business District.
4. The County Government shall strengthen enforcement of planning regulations to ensure orderly urban development.

Officials from the Department of Lands and Urban Development of Isiolo County Government emphasized the importance of adhering to approved urban planning regulations.

Key challenges discussed included:

- Unauthorized building extensions into road reserves
- Encroachment on pedestrian walkways
- Informal developments affecting urban order
- Lack of compliance with building approval procedures

Private sector representatives requested clear guidance and improved coordination with planning authorities to facilitate compliance.

The meeting emphasized the need for:

- Strict enforcement of planning regulations
- Sensitization of business owners on development approval processes
- Protection of road reserves and public spaces
- Promotion of organized commercial development

MIN/4/4/2025 Private Sector Participation in Urban Development

Representatives of the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce and Industry emphasized the importance of active private sector involvement in urban development.

They noted that businesses play a critical role in supporting urban management initiatives, including:

- Participation in environmental management activities
- Support for beautification and urban greening initiatives
- Contribution to urban infrastructure improvements
- Collaboration in security enhancement initiatives

5. Stakeholders shall promote public awareness and compliance with municipal by-laws relating to sanitation, security, and urban planning.
6. Regular stakeholder engagement meetings shall be held to review progress and strengthen collaboration between the public and private sectors.

MIN/1/6/2025 Way Forward




